Environmental Bylaw's limited scope


- Covenanted trees
- Trees within 20m of Hwy 99
- Heritage trees (none)


OCP DPA exemptions























Tree Density Minimum (TDM)

Calculated by zoning and lot size

TDM Ratio based on zoning:

- 60 trees/ha Leisure & residential
- 40 trees/ha Multi-residential
- 20 trees/ha ICI



Tree Density Minimum (TDM)

Example: Single residential lot

- 1. Zoning: SF Residential One= TDM Ratio of 60 trees/ha
- 2. **Lot area:** 557 m² (**0.06** ha)
- 3. $60 \times 0.06 = 3.6$
- 4. Round to 4 trees = TDM





Tree Protection Bylaw Significant Trees

- Covenanted trees
- Within 20m of Hwy 99
- Large Trees (>60cm DBH)
- Old Trees (>250 years)
- Wildlife Habitat Trees



Applicability

- All trees >15cm DBH
- Riparian trees (any size)

Tree Cutting Permits

- **Significant Trees**
- Trees in riparian areas

- Covenanted
- 20m Hwy 99 ROW
- Large >60cm DBH
- Old >250 yrs
- Wildlife habitat

Cutting goes below the Tree Density Minimum
















Replacement Trees

- Related to TDM
- Additional requirements for some Significant Trees
- Retained or new
- Specific criteria
- Hardship



Tree Cutting Permit Application Fee

Currently \$125

- > \$250 for up to 10 trees
- > \$400 for more than 10 trees
